G2 Kunsthalle

Selected artworks from the Hildebrand Collection are permanently on view at the G2 Kunsthalle. The private collection focuses on contemporary painting from Leipzig represented through significant artworks by established artists as well as by younger, emerging names. A second substantial nucleus of the collection consists of national and international artistic movements, currently represented at the G2 through art works by Marcel Dzama, Daniel Richter, Thomas Ruff, Tomás Saraceno and others.

Parallel to the exhibition *Through a Glass, Clearly* parts of the Hildebrand Collection will be presented at G2 Kunsthalle in a new arrangement. Besides new acquisitions by Neo Rauch, David Schnell and Uwe Kowski, works from the collection by, among others, Björn Dahlem, Marcel Dzama, Jens Einhorn, Grit Hachmeister, Gregor Hildebrandt, Anna K.E., Juliana Ortiz, Thomas Ruff, Tal R and Thomas Schütte will be shown for the first time.

Founded in March 2015, the G2 Kunsthalle and its more than 1,000 square meters exhibition space are located in the 3rd floor oft he former GDR processing centre in the city centre of Leipzig. Parallel to the exhibition of the permanent collection, since November 2015 the G2 realizes special exhibitions in collaboration with contemporary artists. From the G2's transparent lounge all visitors enjoy a great view over the city of Leipzig from a unique position in front of the famous Church of St. Thomas.
