G2 Kunsthalle & Hildebrand Collection

Selected art works from the Hildebrand Collection are permanently on view at G2 Kunsthalle. The private collection focuses on contemporary painting from Leipzig, represented through significant art works by established artists as well as by younger, emerging names. A second substantial nucleus of the collection consists of national and international artistic movements. Founded in March 2015, the G2 Kunsthalle and its more than 1,000 square meters exhibition space is located in the 3rd floor of the former GDR processing centre in the city centre of Leipzig.

Parallel to the exhibition »Im Osten nichts Neues – Andreas Mühe / Sebastian Nebe« with loans from the artists Andreas Mühe and Sebastian Nebe, the current presentation of the Hildebrand collection at G2 Kunsthalle includes art works by Hans Aichinger, Benjamin Bergmann, Judith Bernstein, Famed, Richard Deacon, Marcel Dzama, Henriette Grahnert, Paule Hammer, Melissa Gordon, Katrin Heichel, Uwe Kowski, Alicja Kwade, Raymond Pettibon, Jochen Plogsties, Neo Rauch, Daniel Richter, Christoph Ruckhäberle, Tomás Saraceno, Sebastian Schrader, Andreas Schmitt, David Schnell, Ruprecht von Kaufmann and Matthias Weischer.

Furthermore, G2 Kunsthalle realizes special exhibitions in collaboration with contemporary artists with art works from different sources and other private and public collections.

G2 Kunsthalle Art Prize 2018

On October 11, 2018, the »Meisterschülerpreis der G2 Kunsthalle« will be awarded for the second time in collaboration with the Academy of Fine Arts Leipzig (HGB).

The prize, donated by art collector Steffen Hildebrand and G2 Kunsthalle, comprises 10,000 Euro and a studio space for 12 months and is awarded every year among all postgraduates of the Academy of Fine Arts in Leipzig (Absolventen des Meisterschülerstudiums). The winner will be awarded by an expert jury and announced officially on occasion of the exhibition of all postgraduates of the Academy of Fine Arts Leipzig on Thursday October 11, 2018. G2 Kunsthalle established this program in order to promote the art production in the city of Leipzig and to support young artists in an early stage of their career.

The jury 2018 comprises Dr. Jule Hillgärtner (Director of Kunstverein Braunschweig), Eva Huttenlauch (head & curator for contemporary art at Lenbachhaus Munich), Thomas Locher (Rector of HGB Leipzig), Anka Ziefer (Director of G2 Kunsthalle Leipzig) & Steffen Hildebrand (art collector).
