Admission

The admission fee is 5 Euros per person; reduced tickets are available for 3 Euros. Students under 27 are eligible for reduced admission (valid ID / Documents required). No additional charge for public guided tours. Students of Fine Arts and Art History, as well as children under the age of 12, enter free of charge. Children must be accompanied by a parent or responsible adult.

G2 Kunsthalle & Hildebrand Collection

Selected art works from the Hildebrand Collection are permanently on view at G2 Kunsthalle. The private collection focuses on contemporary painting from Leipzig, represented through significant art works by established artists as well as by younger, emerging names. A second substantial nucleus of the collection consists of national and international artistic movements. Founded in March 2015, the G2 Kunsthalle and its more than 1,000 square meters exhibition space are located in the 3rd floor of the former GDR processing centre in the city centre of Leipzig.

Parallel to the exhibition DEN GANZEN TAG AM STRAND with loans from the artists Edgar Leciejewski and Oskar Rink, the current presentation of the Hildebrand collection at G2 Kunsthalle includes art works by Hans Aichinger, Benjamin Bergmann, Judith Bernstein, Famed, Henriette Grahner, Paule Hammer, Melissa Gordon, Katrin Heichel, Uwe Kowski, Alicja Kwade, Raymond Pettibon, Jochen Plogsties, Neo Rauch, Daniel Richter, Christoph Ruckhäberle, Tomás Saraceno, Andreas Schmitten, David Schnell, Ruprecht von Kaufmann, Christian Tomaszewski (C.T. Jasper) and Matthias Weischer.

Furthermore, G2 Kunsthalle realizes special exhibitions in collaboration with contemporary artists with art works from different sources and other private and public collections.

G2 Kunsthalle Art Prize 2017

Artist Robert Sieg, born 1984 in Berlin, is the winner of the first edition of the G2 Kunsthalle Art Prize launched in October 2017 in collaboration with the Academy of Fine Arts Leipzig (HGB).

The prize, donated by art collector Steffen Hildebrand and G2 Kunsthalle, comprises 10,000 Euro and a studio space for 12 months and will be awarded every year among all postgraduates of the Academy of Fine Arts in Leipzig (Absolventen des Meisterschülerstudiums). The winner will be awarded by an expert jury and announced officially on occasion of the exhibition of all postgraduates of the Academy of Fine Arts Leipzig.

G2 Kunsthalle and art collector Steffen Hildebrand decided to establish this program in order to promote the art production in the city of Leipzig and to support young artists in an early stage of their career as professional artists.
