G2 Kunsthalle & Hildebrand Collection

Selected art works from the Hildebrand Collection are permanently on view at G2 Kunsthalle. The private collection focuses on contemporary painting from Leipzig represented through significant art works by established artists as well as by younger, emerging names. A second substantial nucleus of the collection consists of national and international artistic movements. Founded in March 2015, the G2 Kunsthalle and its more than 1,000 square meters exhibition space are located in the 3rd floor of the former GDR processing centre in the city centre of Leipzig.

G2 Kunsthalle celebrates the second anniversary of its foundation with a selection of new acquisitions from the Hildebrand Collection of national and international contemporary art. The exhibition includes paintings, works on paper, photographs and installations by Judith Bernstein, Melissa Gordon, Anne Imhof, Jeanette Mundt, Raymond Pettibon, Daniel Steegmann Mangrané, Rirkrit Tiravanija and other artists.

The permanent presentation of the collection includes art works by Hans Aichinger, Benjamin Bergmann, Björn Dahlem, Marcel Dzama, Jens Einhorn, Sebastian Gögel, Henriette Grahnert, Grit Hachmeister, Paule Hammer, Katrin Heichel, Gregor Hildebrandt, Anna K.E., Uwe Kowski, Peter Krauskopf, Rosa Loy, Juliana Ortiz, Tal R, Neo Rauch, Daniel Richter, Christoph Ruckhäberle, Thomas Ruff, Tomás Saraceno, David Schnell, Kristina Schuldt, Thomas Schütte and Matthias Weischer.

Parallel to the exhibition of the collection, G2 Kunsthalle realizes special exhibitions in collaboration with contemporary artists. The next project COLORS OF DESCENTS with Tobias Hild, Julius Hofmann and Robert Seidel is scheduled for May 2017.
